Admission requirements

1. An acceptable undergraduate degree recognized by the University of Victoria.
2. 3.0 units of approved English (literature and composition).
3. Demonstrated competency in written English.
4. A sessional grade-point average (GPA) of at least 3.00/9-point scale (UVic C+) on the most recent session (if that session is less than 12 units, a GPA of at least 3.00 on the most recent 12 units) and on the most recent 30 units attempted to December 31.
5. Academic preparation in two approved subjects (referred to as teaching concentrations) or a single subject (referred to as a teaching major). A minimum GPA of at least 4.00/9-point scale (UVic B-) is required on the upper-level courses required for the teaching concentrations or major.
6. An interview may also be required.

Notes

- A 3-unit UVic course (same as 6 credits) meets for at least 3 hours per week for 26 weeks (2 terms or one academic year); a 1.5-unit course (same as 3 credits) meets for at least 3 hours per week for 13 weeks (1 term).
- You may be eligible to apply with a 'teaching major' even though you did not complete a major in that subject in your first degree.
- At UVic 'upper-level' refers to 300 and/or 400-level courses.
- Although one teaching major is required for admission to this program, we encourage you to prepare a second teaching area since school districts prefer to hire teachers who have more than one subject specialty.

- ☐ I will have an English major, an English honours degree or UVic's combined major in English and French (Canadian literature). **Go to section A.**
- ☐ I will have an undergraduate degree but will not have a major or honours in English. **Go to section B.**

- **15 units of upper-level English with a B- average** are required if you apply with English as a single teaching area (major). If you haven't completed your degree yet we suggest that you try to include topics listed in section B.
- **9 units of upper-level English with a B- average** are required if you apply with English as one of two teaching areas (concentrations).
- Prospective candidates with 3-year undergraduate degrees will have their transcripts reviewed on a case-by-case basis by the faculty English adviser.
- You'll find the BC secondary English curriculum documents (IRP) on the BC Ministry of Education's website.

Teacher Regulation Branch regulations do not allow us to accept communications, creative writing, journalism or technical writing courses as English composition. **Examples of acceptable UVic courses include: ENGL 115* or 135, 125* or 146, 145* or 147, 200A, 200B, 200C, 201, 202, and 203 (1.5 units each).** *No longer offered.

☐ Completion of 3.0 units of English literature (for example, UVic's ENGL 125 and 145 OR ENGL 146 and 147) with an average grade of B- or better.
Consult an adviser if you have ever completed a composition course with less than a B- grade even if you have since completed two literature courses with a B- average.

If your English grades are not high enough to satisfy this requirement, contact the Teacher Education Advising Office and ask about UVic's English Equivalency Test (EET). It may be an option for you. A grade of B- or better on that test demonstrates competency in written English.

Required grade averages

To be considered for admission, you'll need:

- a C+¹ average on the last 30 units attempted to December 31², and
- a C+ average on the most recent session³ attempted, and
- a B-⁴ average on the upper-level courses required for your teaching area(s). When fewer than 9 units of upper-level courses are required for a teaching area, 200-level courses will be used in the calculation.

¹A C+ is equivalent to 3.00 on UVic's 9-point scale (65 – 69%).

²The 30-unit GPA to December is used rank eligible applicants.

⁴A B- is equivalent to 4.00 on UVic's 9-point scale (70 – 72%).
