## Admission requirements

- 1. An acceptable undergraduate degree recognized by the University of Victoria.
- 2. 3.0 units of approved English (literature and composition).
- 3. Demonstrated competency in written English.
- 4. A sessional grade-point average (GPA) of at least 3.00/9-point scale (UVic C+) on the most recent session (if that session is less than 12 units, a GPA of at least 3.00 on the most recent 12 units) and on the most recent 30 units attempted to December 31.
- 5. Academic preparation in two approved subjects (referred to as teaching concentrations) or a single subject (referred to as a teaching major). A minimum GPA of at least 4.00/9-point scale (UVic B-) is required on the upper-level courses required for the teaching concentrations or major.
- 6. An interview may be required.

## Notes

- A 3-unit UVic course (same as 6 credits) meets for at least 3 hours per week for 26 weeks (2 terms or one academic year); a 1.5-unit course (same as 3 credits) meets for at least 3 hours per week for 13 weeks (1 term).
- You may be eliqible to apply with a 'teaching major' even though you did not complete a major in that subject in your first degree.
- At UVic 'upper-level' refers to 300 and/or 400-level courses.
- Although one teaching major is required for admission to this program, we encourage you to prepare a second teaching area since school districts prefer to hire
  teachers who have more than one subject specialty.

Detailed information about general program admission requirements can be found on the reverse side of this document.

All prospective candidates, including native speakers of Mandarin, require at least 12.0 units of university-level Mandarin courses to qualify for admission. Prospective Mandarin candidates will have their transcripts reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

Alert! All prospective candidates, both native and non-native speakers, must successfully pass a language competency examination (oral and written) normally held in April.
