Shared Decision Making Using Personal Health Record Technology: A Scoping Review at The Crossroads

Shared decision-making (SDM) is touted as the pinnacle of patient-centered care, yet it has been difficult to implement in clinical practice. Personal health record (PHR) technology supports patient—centered care by making all relevant information and tools available to support self-management. Still, today PHRs are underutilized. This scoping review of the literature aims to determine the size and range of the published literature on SDM using PHR technology and to map the literature in terms of system design and outcomes.

Selena Davis is a PhD candidate in health informatics and has 20+ years of combined experience in the Canadian healthcare, health informatics industries and in research and academia. She works as an independent Health Informatics consultant. She is also an Adjunct Professor in Dept. of Family Practice, Faculty of Medicine at UBC. Selena holds a Master of Health Informatics from Dalhousie University, a Bachelor of Education from the University of Western Ontario and a Bachelor of Applied Health Science degree in Kinesiology and Chemistry from the University of Waterloo.
