EMERGING LEADER IN HEALTH INFORMATICS AWARD

Sherman Quan, ('03) Health Informatician, Department of Medicine, Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre was the 2006 winner of the COACH Emerging Leader in Health Informatics Award. Rhonda Chou, Principal of the Courtyard Group, presented him with the award at the recent awards banquet.

This award recognizes individuals who are in the first five years of their career, who have clearly demonstrated leadership and achieved early success in the field.

Among numerous other achievements, Mr. Quan's leadership in forming a partnership with the Corporate Information Services group was a key turning point for moving the hospital's e-Health agenda forward, creating a culture where physicians and other multidisciplinary staff are embracing technology as an approach for improving patient care. He is actively involved in research projects that involve multiple organizations, the benefits of which include the improved utilization of existing resources, increased ability to encourage investments from granting agencies and industry, and better common user interfaces for shared faculty and trainees.

Sherman Quan graduated from Health Information Science at UVic in 2003. Since then, in his role at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre, he has continued to support the School by hiring and supervising co-op students.

Nicole's research evaluates the pilot implementation of an Electronic Health Record using Participatory Action Research. Research collaborators are the Universities of Alberta, Calgary, Central Lancashire (UK), and Bergen (Norway), and in Tanzania: Haydom Lutheran Hospital, the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania (ELCT) Health, the Africa Regional Youth Initiative, and the Ifakara Health Research and Development Centre.

MISCELLANEOUS

Stan Dubas, former BC Deputy Minister of Health and a close friend of the School passed away in December at the age of 70. Mr. Dubas was one of the School’s dedicated sessional lecturers in its early days. From 1983-85, though he was busy being the province’s Deputy Minister of Health, he took on the responsibility for a full course -- the old version of the current HINF 140. He held his classes in his offices at 1515 Blanshard and senior Ministry of Health staff would jokingly complain that they were envious - our students spent more time with the Deputy than they did.

Mr. Dubas’s contribution to the School was however more significant during the period that the School was on the verge of being cancelled due to the severe economic down turn that BC experienced in the 80’s -- only a few years after the School had gotten started. On his own and without prompting, Mr. Dubas was instrumental in influencing the UVic Board of Directors that our program should be maintained at all costs - not withstanding the University’s need to make financial cuts. As a result of his intervention, we managed to survive those difficult years. We would not have close to 600 graduates scattered around the world today if he had not done what he did.
