As part of the Intellectual and Cultural Summer Program in 2024 JD and JID students may enrol in an "in house" Intellectual Property Moot course.

The course will be coordinated and supervised by Professor Howell.

Students may register in Online Tools on their designated registration date.

### **Description**

At the start of term (May 8) the moot court problem will be made available to students who will also be assigned as Appellant or Respondent. In each moot there will be one student arguing the whole of the Appellant side and one student arguing the whole of the Respondent side.

During May through to mid-June students will complete their research and prepare an Appellant factum or Respondent factum as assigned.

**The date for the completion of the facta is Friday, June 14th.** Instructions will be given as to the process of submitting the facta.

**Commencing on Monday, 24 June** there will be a schedule of selected times for in-person oral argument practice sessions. These will likely take place in the evenings June 24 to July 16 (from 5.00 pm to 7.30 pm) as they will be before Professor Howell and practitioners. The latter will not be available during the day.

The final session will be in-person before a panel of judges. Justice Michael Manson of the Federal Court of Canada will preside.

These final sessions will be scheduled from **Thursday, 18th July through Saturday, 20th of July.** The course will end at the conclusion of these hearings.

### **Evaluation Methodology**
