What do you do when your language has been targeted for destruction by the most powerful government in the history of the planet and that refuses to acknowledge your existence? How can you respond to the intellectual erasure perpetrated by 200 years of officious publications declaring that your nation is extinct? How do you carry forward the vision of your Elders and gift it to your grandchildren? In reflecting on these questions Dr. Grounds will walk through the challenges, short-falls, and the roadblocks Yuchi community is struggling with and share experience from the ground on how Yuchi language stewards were able to create the first in a century new cohort of first-language speakers.
