Canada's universities make the grade globally

Influential rankings put nine schools in top 200 with University of Toronto edging out McGill for the top spot in Canada, using new yardstick for excellence

The University of Toronto has nabbed a spot among the top 20 universities in the world, in what is arguably the most influential set of global university rankings, while eight other Canadian schools

anked within the top 200. While the United States and Britain dominated Times Higher Education's World University Rankings, Canada more than held its own as the fifth-best performing country. The methodology behind the ranking was also radically overhauled this year, with

Times Higher Education partnering with Thomson Reuters to expand the amount of data in a bid to produce the most accurate international yardstick of university excellence. Schools are scored based on a broad range of indicators, including the number of papers published, the number of




Student satisfaction: quality of instruction





Overall program satisfaction











UVic success rate for NSERC postgraduate and Canada graduate scholarships


UVic success rate for SSHRC doctoral Canada graduate scholarships and doctoral fellowships



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


Student success: CIS national championships



CIS national championships won - cumulative 1968 to 2009/10














UVic in the community






