

#### PROJECT INTRODUCTION

Ensure that the health, vitality and maintenance of the existing mature trees will be a key driver of the design resolution.




4. Ensure that issues relating to personal safety and universal design are fully considered and addressed in the Landscape Plan.





Clarify preferred travel routes and other connections that:


- Reinforce the Quadrangle

- Provide safe, direct access to both activity hubs and more isolated areas.






**CONNECTING NATURE** 

Strengthen UVic's unique natural assets by creating a "green ring" of ecological corridors around the perimeter of campus.




A RENEWED COMMITMENT TO WALKABILITY

Make UVic an even better campus for walking.




RING ROAD AS A PEOPLE PLACE

Re-imagine Ring Road as a place for people: a place for walking, cycling, lingering, socializing, and more.




NEW AND INVIGORATED CENTRES OF ANIMATION

#### INDIGENOUS DESIGN

As part of the design and process, the project will explore opportunities to recognize and preserve the spirit of place inherited from the past, and connect students to Indigenous communities and the history of the traditional territories where UVic resides.

The project design process will explore opportunities to include design elements that can educate the campus community about Indigenous history and culture. Any such design elements shall acknowledge and respect the Lkwungenspeaking peoples on whose traditional territory the university stands and the Songhees, Esquimalt and WSÁNEĆ peoples whose historical relationships with the land continue to this day.



#### BIKING

The Campus Cycling Plan proposed a 'Shared Space and Safety' strategy to improve pedestrian-cyclist interactions within Ring Road managed through design-based mitigation strategies, including;

- o Education and Awareness,
- o Speed Management,
- o Signage, Signals, and Lighting






#### EXISTING GRAND PROMENADE SITE PLAN - CENTRAL









**EXISTING GRAND PROMENADE SITE PLAN - WEST** 































# PROMENADE TREES

The campus landscape reflects native plant material of Vancouver Island including such plants as Gary Oak, Dogwood and other conifers.

An important theme in the development of the campus is the landscape itself. The heart of the campus is defined by the main quadrangle. The quadrangle expresses, both planned and natural landscape elements and serves as the major pedestrian route through the campus.

Within Ring Road, the major tree framework binds buildings and open areas in a unified composition. This tree framework of evergreen trees (broadleaf and conifers) is used primarily, in mass, to frame vistas, backgrounds, and as extensions of natural areas.

The Campus Plan identifies preservation and enhancment of the Grand Promenade vegetation as a priority in order to reinforce the overall character of the campus.
