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### What competencies will you develop through your program?

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use effective counselling and communication skills</li> <li>• Conduct case assessment, case management and risk assessment (suicide, sexual abuse and family violence)</li> <li>• Deliver therapeutic and crisis interventions</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Use critical thinking and ethical decision-making</li> <li>• Understand and use appropriate skills when communicating with children, youth, families, groups and communities</li> <li>• Provide developmental and culturally appropriate practice</li> </ul> |
