Annually each fall, it is updated with <u>program application instructions</u> and information for the following September intake. Applicants must also satisfy the <u>experience requirement</u> described there.

If you have completed science courses **in topics relevant to the BC secondary school science 8-10 curriculum**, but not the requirements specified for a teachable subject area in biology, chemistry or physics, you may be eliqible for the general science teachable subject area.

General science <u>cannot be combined with</u> the biology, chemistry, or physics teachable subject area (if admitted with one of those areas, you will automatically be eligible for general science program experiences).

General science teachers need a diverse science background to teach the varied science topics of the BC grade 8-10 science curriculum.

Due to **limited practicum opportunities and program seats**, we strongly recommend combining this subject with another teachable subject other than social studies.
