If admitted to Year One Elementary Education (direct entry from high school):

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR PROGRESSION TO PROGRAM YEAR TWO (SEPTEMBER 2024):

- October 2023 to January 2024: see www.uvic.ca/education/areas-study/teacher-ed/index.php for current instructions for satisfying all eligibility requirements, including the experience requirement, all required documents, and deadlines.
- <u>Jan 31</u>: deadline to email your program declaration request to Education Advising at <u>adve@uvic.ca</u>. (Request to "declare your program for progression to program year two in September 2024.") Deadline for all required supporting documents.
- Jan 31: deadline to submit the "experience requirement" documents (see program website above in the fall). In addition to providing
 the documents described there, you may be invited to discuss your relevant experiences in-person.
- April 30: deadline for completion of 12 units of core year one courses (see page 1; lines 1 to 4) and satisfaction of the English and Math grade requirements (see page 1).
- A minimum sessional GPA of 3.0/9-point scale (UVic C+) on the most recent session/term and most recent 12 units attempted.

Applying for Year Two Admission (September 2024) - from another UVic faculty or another university or college:

October 2023 to January 2024: See www.uvic.ca/education/areas-study/teacher-ed/index.php for current application instructions, eligibility requirements, applicant selection criteria, the experience requirement, all required documents, and deadlines.

Jan 31: Deadline for receipt of <u>program application</u>, <u>experience requirement documents</u>, and <u>official transcripts</u> from <u>all</u> post-secondary institution(s), showing completed courses <u>and in-progress registrations to April</u> (including grades for December and previous studies).

May 31: Deadline for receipt of official transcripts showing grades to April 30 to confirm completion of all academic admission requirements.

Eligibility for year two admission to the BEd (Elementary Curriculum) program in September requires:

- April 30: deadline for completion of 12 units of core year one courses (see lines 1-4 on page 1) and satisfying the English and Math grade requirements (see page 1).
- A minimum* sessional GPA of 3.0/9-point scale (UVic C+) on the most recent session/term and most recent 12 units attempted.
- Satisfaction of the <u>experience requirement</u> of the Teacher Education Office (see program website above in the fall). In addition to providing the documents described there <u>by January 31</u>, you may be invited to discuss your relevant experiences in-person.

*If the number of eligible applicants exceeds the available year two seats for the upcoming year, not all will be admitted.

Approved UVic Year One Course Options (obtain approval for courses not listed here or planned elsewhere):

English (two literature courses OR one literature course with one academic composition course) (3 units):

Two from ENSH 101=literature (formerly ENGL 146), ENSH 102=literature (formerly ENGL 147), ATWP 135=composition (formerly ENGL 135).

- Other, similar courses in English literature or composition topics will be considered.
- Courses must satisfy the university's academic writing requirement. For example, ATWP 101 (formerly ENGL 101) is not approved.
- Technical writing, communications and creative writing courses are not accepted (e.g. do <u>not</u> take ENSH 202 or a WRIT course unless as academic electives).

Canadian Studies (3 units): Two from CS 102, CS 201, ECON 100, GNDR 203, HSTR 230A, HSTR 230B, IS 101, IS 201, POLI 101, POLI 201, SOCI 103.

- Pan-Canadian topics are recommended; a maximum of one regional studies course (1.5 units) may be accepted upon individual review.
- Canadian literature and courses with fine arts topics (ex CS 101) are not accepted towards this social studies content requirement.

Mathematics (3 units): Two from MATH (100, 102, or 109), 101, 151, 161*, 162*. *MATH 161 (Sept) and MATH 162 (Jan) are recommended.

- At least one of your two courses in approved Math must have been completed no more than ten years before entry to program year two.
- Pre-calculus and introductory college algebra courses are not accepted. For example, MATH 120 is not approved.

Science (3 units): Two from ASTR 101, 102; BIOL 184, 186, (see BIOL 150A/B note below); CHEM 101, 102; EOS 110, 120, 130(=GEOG 130); EPHE 141; GEOG 103; PHYS 102A, 102B. Selecting more than one subject is encouraged for beneficial teaching preparation.

- · Choosing science courses with a laboratory is strongly encouraged for hands-on learning beneficial to future classroom teaching.
- EOS 120 often offers a lab section for pre-education students (but any lab section is acceptable); see the course timetable.
- BIOL 150A and/or 150B are acceptable if you do not have the prerequisite to take BIOL 184 or 186 and if you haven't previously completed BIOL 184 or 186.
- A maximum of one <u>approved</u> human science (anatomy/physiology) course (1.5 units) will be accepted (ex EPHE 141).
- At least one of your two courses in approved science must have been completed no more than ten years before entry to program year two.
- Social Science courses such as anthropology, geography (human, environmental, regional, etc) and psychology are not acceptable.

Academic Electives (3 units):

- Choose subjects related to those <u>taught</u> in the BC elementary school curriculum. For example, take additional Canadian studies or science courses listed above or select from **computer science**, **French**, **geography**, **history**, **Indigenous studies**, **music**, **psychology**, **sociology**, **theatre**, and/or **visual arts**. *Note: French is encouraged as schools are often keen to hire teachers with this knowledge*.
- We can't accept courses from professional (career-oriented) programs such as child and youth care, social work, or teacher education. For example, do <u>not</u> take AE 103A, AE 103B, ED-D 101, EPHE 143, or MUS 131. The following first-year Faculty of Education courses are exceptions to this rule and <u>will</u> be accepted as academic electives: EPHE 141, EPHE 142 and EPHE 155.
