

# Bachelor of Education Post-Degree Professional Program (Elementary)

Information handout for students preparing for 2025 program admission

Based on the September 2024 University of Victoria calendar, college and university websites, and the [online BC transfer guide](#). This information is subject to change if these sources change.



This program provides engaging, relevant, and high-quality preparation for the responsibilities and challenges of today's classrooms. Upon completion of this program, you will be eligible for a Bachelor of Education degree (UVic) and a professional teaching certificate (BC Teacher Regulation Branch). BC teacher certificate holders are eligible to apply for teacher certification elsewhere in Canada.

This program is offered in two locations: Victoria, BC and Cranbrook, BC (on the campus of the College of the Rockies).

- Victoria: offered in four terms over 16 months, beginning in September and ending in December of the following year (fall, spring, summer, and fall terms).
- Cranbrook: completed over two academic years (no courses are scheduled during the summer session).

### Academic requirements:

In addition to an undergraduate bachelor's degree and minimum grade, GPA and experience requirements, you will need 3.0 units (two courses) in each of approved: English, Canadian studies, math, and science. More details below.

- 3.0 units at UVic is equivalent to 6.0-8.0 credits at most BC post-secondary institutions.

This handout provides you with approved English, Canadian studies, mathematics, and science courses offered at four post-secondary institutions in BC. Check with the institutions to find out about course availability, registration, and important dates. If you're seeking a flexible course schedule, there are some **online options** at College of the Rockies, North Island College and Thompson Rivers University.

**IMPORTANT:** To avoid course duplication, consider completing both courses from a particular subject (English, Canadian studies, math, or science) at the same institution. If you want to 'mix and match' institutions please ensure the courses are not duplicate and they do not contain overlap in content. If you are unsure, consult Education Advising.

**Experience requirement:** You'll also be asked to provide evidence of your experience, ability, and interest in working with groups of children in educative ways. Please refer to the [program website](#) for more details about this requirement, including the number of hours required (*updated each September for the following year's intake*).

## Approved English literature and composition (required: 3.0 units or two half-year courses)

We will accept two literature courses **OR** one literature and one composition course.

Teacher certification regulations do not allow us to accept communications, cultural studies, creative writing, technical writing, or two composition courses.

**English Grade Requirement:** a grade of at least C+/UVic 3.00 in each course.

## Approved Canadian studies (required: 3.0 units or two half-year courses)

We will accept courses that **focus on the Canadian experience** within topics taught in BC's elementary **social studies curriculum**. Choose pan-Canadian courses over regional Canadian courses (at most, one regional course will be considered). Courses using Canadian examples in the study of a subject (rather than focusing on Canada) are not approved. Teacher certification regulations won't allow us to accept Canadian literature, fine arts, or art history courses towards this requirement.

## Approved mathematics (required: 3.0 units or two half-year courses)

We will consider courses offered by a **mathematics department**. We are not able to accept algebra or pre-calculus courses.  
**Statistics limit:** at most, one course in statistics will be considered if taught by a mathematics department.  
**Math Currency:** at least one of these two courses must have been completed within ten years prior to program entry.  
**Math Grade Requirement:** an average of at least **C+/UVic 3.00** in your two approved Math courses.

## Approved science (required: 3.0 units or two half-year courses)

Try to choose courses from *two different subjects* to develop a more comprehensive background for teaching all science subjects in your elementary classroom. We recommend courses with a **weekly lab** but will accept courses without a lab component.  
**Science Currency:** at least one of these two courses must have been completed within ten years prior to program entry.  
**Human anatomy/physiology limit:** at most, one course in this topic will be considered.
