### **Program admission requirements**

- 1. Admissibility to the university. Undergraduate Admissions Services determines eligibility for admission to UVic.
- 2. An acceptable undergraduate Bachelor's degree recognized by Undergraduate Admissions Services.
- 3. 3 units of approved English literature (or English literature and academic composition).
- 4. Demonstrated competency in written English (grade requirement; see page two).
- 5. See the three grade point average (GPA) requirements described on page two.
- Approved academic studies in one or two teachable subjects relevant to the BC curriculum. A list of available subjects is provided on the website below.
- 7. Applicants must satisfy the experience requirement described on the program website below. Eligible applicants may also be invited to attend an interview.
- 8. For current <u>applicant selection criteria</u>, please see the program website below. This is subject to change for future intakes; please see the program website updated annually each fall for the upcoming intake.

#### **Notes**

- A 1.5-unit course (equivalent to 3-4 credits at most institutions) meets for at least 3 hours per week for 13 weeks (one term).
- At UVic, 'upper-level' refers to 300 and/or 400-level courses normally taken in third and fourth year after introductory studies.

### FOR SEPTEMBER 2023 PROGRAM ENTRY ONLY:

The course set described on the self-assessment form for September 2022 entry will be an acceptable alternative to the course set below.

Lines 1 - 8: 12 units of upper-level courses must be in the subject of "English," and taught by an English Department.

<u>\*Lines 9 & 10</u>: 3 units of additional upper-level English studies or up to 3 units 200-level English is approved on these lines. Up to 1.5 units of the following course work may be accepted on these lines: 200-level or higher writing (WRIT) course work or EDCI 355 (Literature for Young Adults)/EDCI 356 (Expanding Notions of Text). May not exceed a total of 3 units with these exceptions.
