*Admission requirements are subject to change for future intakes. Please watch for updates on the program website below.

Program admission requirements

1. Admissibility to the university. Undergraduate Admissions Services determines eligibility for admission to UVic.
2. An acceptable undergraduate Bachelor's degree recognized by Undergraduate Admissions Services.
3. 3 units of approved English literature (or English literature and academic composition).
4. Demonstrated competency in written English (grade requirement; see page two).
5. See the three grade point average (GPA) requirements described on page two.
6. Approved academic studies in one or two teachable subjects relevant to the BC curriculum. A list of available subjects is provided on the website below.
7. Applicants must satisfy the experience requirement described on the program website below. Eligible applicants may also be invited to attend an interview.
8. For current applicant selection criteria, please see the program website below. This is subject to change for future intakes; please see the program website updated annually each fall for the upcoming intake.

Notes

- A 1.5-unit course (equivalent to 3-4 credits at most institutions) meets for at least 3 hours per week for 13 weeks (one term).
- At UVic, 'upper-level' refers to 300 and/or 400-level courses normally taken in third and fourth year after introductory studies.

Teachable subject area: Physical & Health Education

To qualify for the physical and health education teachable subject area, you'll need the 15 units of specified courses listed below. Those who have completed equivalent course work elsewhere may also be eligible for admission (course descriptions or outlines will be needed). Optional: combine PHE with a second approved teachable subject area.

UVic students may explore taking the courses listed below (and possibly also the specified courses towards another teachable subject area) as follows:
a) within any faculty's first-degree program either as electives or as the *Minor in Physical & Health Education*, or b) as part of the Faculty of Education's *Recreation & Health Education* degree program, or c) as part of the Faculty of Education's *Kinesiology* degree program, or d) as non-degree studies if an undergraduate degree has already been completed. Consult the academic adviser for your chosen degree program to find out if these courses may be used in your first degree.

Anatomy/physiology courses completed elsewhere will also be considered by the School of Exercise Science, Physical and Health Education towards this prerequisite requirement.

Approved English (2 courses, each worth 1.5 UVic units)

We will accept two literature courses **OR** one literature course with one academic composition course.

Examples of acceptable English courses: Literature: ENGL 146, 147, 200A, 200B, 200C, 201, 202, 203, 207, 208, 209, 260.
Composition: 1 of ATWP 135 (formerly ENGL 135 or 115) or ENGL 215.

BC Teacher Certification regulations do not allow us to accept courses in business/technical writing, communications, creative writing, journalism, linguistics, some cultural studies topics, or more than 1.5 units of composition. Preparatory/fundamental English courses which do not satisfy UVic's Academic Writing Requirement are not acceptable (for example, UVic ATWP 101, formerly ENGL 101).

Minimum Grade Point Averages

To be considered for selection by the Faculty, you'll need to satisfy the following three GPA requirements (refer to program website updated annually each fall for more information):

- An average of at least UVic 3.00/C+ on the most recent 30 units of graded studies attempted to December.
- An average of at least UVic 3.00/C+ on the most recent sessional GPA of at least 12 units of graded studies attempted.
- An average of at least UVic 4.00/B- on the specified courses included in the teachable subject area(s).

This is calculated by Undergraduate Admissions Services upon application.
