Applicants must also satisfy the [experience requirement](#) described there.

Courses will be accepted in **history, geography, political science, sociology, anthropology, and economics** if they are approved as being related to the BC social studies curriculum. For example, UVic's ECON 321 The Economic History of Canada is approved but not ECON 310B Competition Policy. We will also accept social studies related courses from **Canadian studies, Asian & Pacific studies, gender/women's studies, Indigenous studies** (other than education-related), **urban studies and environmental studies** if they are related to history, geography, political science, sociology, anthropology, or economics. A limited number of courses from classical/Greek & Roman studies, criminology, international relations, law, or religious studies may be considered on a case-by-case basis.

- ☐ At least **10 courses (15 units¹) at the upper level³** are needed to qualify for social studies as a **single teachable subject area** or
- ☐ At least **8 courses (12 units¹)**, including **6 upper-level³ courses (9 units)** are needed to qualify for social studies as **1 of 2 teachable subject areas**

- If you otherwise satisfy the AWR above, then other similar courses in English literature or composition topics will be considered. The following would also be acceptable as English literature: ENSH 210, ENSH 211, ENSH 212, ENSH 223A, ENSH 223B, ENSH 224, ENSH 250, ENSH 251, ENSH 253, ENSH 254, ENSH 255. *Note: While courses with similar titles at other colleges/universities might not be acceptable, the following UVic courses are also approved English literature: ENSH 200, 220, 221.*
- Preparatory/fundamental English courses which do not satisfy UVic's AWR are not acceptable. (For example, ATWP 101 (formerly ENGL 101) and ATWP 110 are not approved.)
- BC teacher certification regulations do not allow us to: waive the English requirement, accept two English composition courses, accept courses in business/technical writing, communications, creative writing, journalism, linguistics or some cultural studies.

To be considered for selection by the faculty, you will need to satisfy the following minimum GPA requirements:

- An average of at least UVic 3.00/C+ on the most recent sessional GPA of 30 units of graded studies attempted to December.
- An average of at least UVic 3.00/C+ on the most recent sessional GPA of 12 units of graded studies attempted.
- An average of at least UVic 4.00/B- on the specified courses included in the teachable subject area(s).

The GPA included as part of applicant selection criteria this intake: the most recent sessional GPA of 12 units of graded studies attempted to December 2025.

Upon application, Undergraduate Admissions Services calculates applicants' GPAs and determines university admission eligibility.
