Admissions Requirement

Indigenous Education in the Faculty of Education in partnership with the School of Languages, Linguistics, and Cultures in the Faculty of Humanities offers a full-time Graduate Certificate program in Indigenous Language Revitalization, which ladders into a Masters Degree.

Applicants to all the Indigenous Education graduate programs must follow the admission procedures and meet the minimum requirements set out by the Faculty of Graduate Studies in the Faculty Admissions section of the calendar. In addition, Indigenous Education allows exceptional entry admission on a case by case basis with support of the academic unit.

The application to the Master of Arts degree requires the agreement of a regular faculty member to supervise the student before entry to the program. Students should indicate their interest in the Master of Arts program in the Statement of Intent and also explain their thesis study intentions.

Applicants must submit two letters of reference (the same two letters required for admission to Faculty of Graduate Studies), provided by two referees who can be a professional colleague, professor or other academic authority, or an Indigenous Language Authority.

Applicants must submit a statement of intent describing their interest in the program and how they plan to use the program to promote community development in Indigenous language and culture revitalization.

First priority will go to applicants who are proficient/literate or semi-proficient/ literate in any Indigenous language.

Application Process

All applicants must complete and submit the following:

- 1. The online application form to the Faculty of Graduate Studies: https:// www.uvic.ca/graduate/admissions/howto-apply/index.php. Applicants will be required to pay the application fee via credit card.
- 2. Two letters of reference (the same two letters required for admission to Faculty of Graduate Studies), provided by two referees who can be a professional colleague, professor or other academic authority, or an Indigenous Language Authority.
- 3. Statement of Intent (500 word max). Describing their interest in the program and how they plan to use the program to promote community development in Indigenous language and culture revitalization.
- 4. Transcripts (can be unofficial transcripts), submitted electronically during the online application process.

Exceptional Entry

Exceptional entry is available to applicants to the graduate programs who have extensive expertise in the language and culture of their respective communities and have shown significant leadership in language and culture revitalization projects but do not hold a baccalaureate degree.

Exceptional entry applications must provide:

- a) a profile or CV
- b) portfolio indicating previous education (certificates and diplomas), related professional experience, and training
- c) an additional letter of reference attesting to the applicant's level of fluency from an Indigenous Language Authority,
- d) as well as the regular application requirements to Graduate Studies.

The evidence provided in the form of a profile and portfolio will be holistically considered, weighing the sum total of all previous education and experience for preparedness and suitability for the program.

Guidelines for profile and portfolio will be included in the application materials as well as posted on the Indigenous Education website.

Applicants in this category are encouraged to begin preparation of the portfolio well in advance of the application and documentation deadlines in order to receive feedback and assistance in its preparation and submission for consideration by the Program Admissions Committee.
