<sup>1</sup>Thesis students take two electives. Project students take three electives. Electives will usually be courses from other programs or departments, selected in consultation with your supervisor based on your academic interests and career goals. To take an elective course from outside the Counselling Psychology MA program you will submit a <u>Graduate course registration form</u>, with signatures from the course instructor and your supervisor.

<sup>2</sup> You may or may not start working on your thesis as early as summer of year 1. You will end up registering in your thesis in numerous terms. If you are working on your thesis in any term, then you should be registered in it.

<sup>3</sup>Students whose thesis does not rely heavily on statistical analysis are encouraged to replace **ED-D 560** Statistical Methods in Education with a different methods course (from any department) that is more relevant to their thesis. To take a replacement course you will submit a <u>Graduate course registration form</u>, with signatures from the course instructor and your supervisor.
