

There is so much to do in Victoria during the summer it is almost impossible to do it all – but it is worth a try. Please enjoy this summer events calendar from the UVic Family Centre.





The opposite happens during shorter day light period. The only ones who experiences this feeling regularly is living in higher longitude position and never by a person who lives near equator line. Victoria is approximately at 48.25 degree away from the equator line towards north. The equator line is an imaginary line of latitude that goes around the waist of earth and divides it into north and south poles. Longitude is also imaginary line that goes around the earth from north to south. To locate a place these lines are divided in degrees. I can try to overcome man made problems but cannot seem to manage beautiful but stubborn natural rules.
