

Letter of Intent

To obscure the boundary between reality and fiction I build immersive environments and obsolete devices that incorporate video and sculpture, where viewers are invited to experience a world that is simultaneously ancient and futuristic. I am fascinated by places and objects much older than myself because they suggest the presence of another world. Through layering visible expressions of time I reproduce the sense of deep memory that archaic machines or decaying buildings evoke, and provide access to their history or purpose through video. By projecting an old world into the distant future and merging familiarity with strangeness, I confront my longing for comfort in an uncertain future. The props and sets I build pass back and forth between physical and virtual space, linking the fictional world and the real. The efficiency of this process, as well as the accumulation of history through reuse inspires new works.

I want to pursue an MFA because it gives me the time and space to ask questions about my art and open new ways of understanding my practice. I look forward to being prolific in my efforts to make video work by having regular access to recording equipment, studio space, and editing suites. To advance my practice I want to utilize new methods in video production such as photogrammetry, Unreal Engine 5, and live camera tracking. Researching how my art can more concisely communicate ideas about the future, automation, isolation, and ecological collapse will strengthen my art. Being able to streamline my workflow and reduce the production time for video work will allow me to spend more time researching themes in my art and generate momentum in my practice. I want to explore constructing multipurpose devices that combine video, audio, and sculpture which manipulate space and create portals that transport viewers from the gallery experience to something otherworldly. Feedback from peers and visiting artists will provide insight essential to that process and give me a better understanding of how my art may contribute to contemporary art. Most of all I look forward to sharing knowledge and helping others by reducing technical barriers in art production. The best memories of my undergrad were helping others overcome technical challenges in their practice. My love of teaching is why I pursued a BFA, and now an MFA.

I'm confident I would be an ideal MFA candidate because of my previous experiences with teaching. A highlight of my time at UVic was working as a Sim Lab supervisor in the Fine Arts building, helping students learn to use creative software. In the final year of my undergrad I demonstrated strong leadership skills during my time as chair of our graduating exhibition.

My current practice is rooted in Victoria materially and conceptually. The connections I have made with other artists and faculty here are important to my continuing research. The art I make is built from recurring materials, props, and sculptures that take on significance through repeated use. This technique is something I want to push farther without restarting. I have ongoing relationships with artists and communities that I want to maintain and continue working with during my MFA. Only by studying at UVic can I continue learning from artists already familiar with my art, as well as gain fresh perspectives from others, benefiting from both avenues of critique.

My undergrad at UVic was a wonderful experience in many ways. The faculty were supportive and encouraging. I would love the chance to work with them as a TA or technical advisor. After completing my MFA I would like to work at UVic and help to improve accessibility for art production in the Visual Arts Building. During my undergrad and since, I have observed a need for more technical support in the department. I know that I could add value to the Visual Arts program and help improve outcomes for students of all skill levels. I'm eager to expand my practice and push the boundaries of my research at UVic.
