Co-op students looking to contribute to social change on a global scale have had a new way to gain work experience thanks to a partnership between UVic and the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR)—one of UVic's 2024 Co-op Employers of the Year.

Three UVic students have been hired to work at the UNITAR's headquarters office in Geneva, Switzerland, where they've helped develop training workshops about water management, maternal and infant health, breastfeeding education and more.

For Master of Public Administration student Erica Dolman, who completed a co-op work term at UNITAR last fall, the experience was life-changing. Erica led activities of UNITAR's Breastfeeding Education Initiative (BFEI), using the concepts she learned in the MPA program to develop micro-learnings and supported the BFEI's goals.

"I was entrusted with meaningful responsibilities that allowed me to connect my academic learning to real-world applications. These opportunities helped me grow not only as a professional but also as an individual."

Tuition and financial support

TUITION

FUNDING YOUR GRADUATE STUDIES

Funding for your graduate studies may come in the form of a UVic fellowship, teaching assistantship, research assistantship or a combination of all three. You may also be eligible for a wide range of needs-based bursaries, and internally and externally funded awards. Certain projects that include a significant research component may also be eligible for research council funding. See your range of options at uvic.ca/graduatestudies/finances and be sure to identify any additional funding opportunities available from your academic unit.

TEACHING ASSISTANTSHIPS AND RESEARCH ASSISTANTSHIPS

You can apply through your academic unit for several forms of paid employment that will provide valuable professional development opportunities throughout your degree. These opportunities include working as a teaching assistant (TA) or research assistant (RA). Applicants should speak with their prospective supervisor about the availability of these opportunities. These opportunities are not available in all programs.

GRADUATE FELLOWSHIPS, AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

UVic provides a variety of scholarships to graduate students:

- University of Victoria Graduate Fellowship (doctoral or master's) – up to \$20,000
- University of Victoria President's Research Scholarship for federal council scholarship holders – \$5,000
- University of Victoria Graduate Entrance Award for new first-class graduate students – \$5,000
- A variety of donor-sponsored graduate scholarships – \$1,000 to \$30,000

These programs—thesis-based master's degrees and PhDs—focus on generating new knowledge and advancing theory. At UVic, you'll engage in original research, often resulting in publications or conference presentations. You'll work closely with expert faculty, contribute to scholarly conversations and help shape the future of your discipline. If you're ready to explore, question and contribute, a research-based path could be for you.

- Are you preparing to lead in industry, government, education or healthcare?
- Do you want a graduate degree that fits your career and your schedule?

If this sounds like you, explore UVic's **professional-based graduate programs**.

These include professional master's degrees and doctorates to help working professionals enhance their expertise and lead change in their fields. Programs focus on leadership, innovation, policy and applied knowledge. Many offer flexible formats, cohort learning, and opportunities for practicum or community partnerships. Admission requirements

ADMISSION TO A MASTER'S PROGRAM

- Completion of a four-year bachelor's degree (or equivalent) from an institution recognized by UVic
- Equivalent of a minimum "B" average over the last two years of your degree
- Must meet UVic's English language proficiency requirement
- Must meet any requirements specific to your program of study

ADMISSION TO A DOCTORAL PROGRAM

- Completion of an acceptable master's degree (or equivalent) from an institution recognized by UVic
- Must meet UVic's English language proficiency requirement
- Must meet any requirements specific to your program of study

or

- If you have a first-class average in the last two years of a bachelor's degree, you may also be considered
- Must meet UVic's English language proficiency requirement
- Must meet any requirements specific to your program of study

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

You must demonstrate English language proficiency to attend UVic. You meet this requirement if:

- English is your primary language
- you have a degree from a designated English-speaking country
- you have a degree from a recognized institution at which the language of instruction is English

We accept six language tests as proof of language proficiency: CAEL, CAE/CPE, IELTS, MET, PTE and TOEFL. Official test score reports must be sent directly to UVic by the testing agency.

We cannot accept test scores more than two years old.

How to apply

1. BEFORE YOU APPLY

Admission to UVic Graduate Studies is competitive. It's never too early to contact your academic unit and start planning your application to make yourself as attractive a candidate as possible. Our website lists all the important steps you need to take before you apply, such as reviewing admission requirements, required documents and English language proficiency requirements.

Most graduate programs require students to have a supervisor. A great supervisor oversees your academic work, is passionate about your subject area and is invested in your success. There is some variation when it comes to academic supervision at UVic, so be sure to confirm the specific details with your program's graduate secretary. You may be assigned a supervisor or be expected to find your own. In some instances, you must identify an available supervisor before you begin your studies.

Learning as much as you can about the faculty members who you will be working with increases your chances for success. Faculty members may be more willing to act as your supervisor if you

- make contact well in advance of your desired academic entry point,
- develop a statement of your research interests and preferred areas of focus,
- spend time exploring their research, publications, funding sources and CVs, and
- consider the mutual time investment required.

If you're responsible for identifying a supervisor, we recommend you talk to several professors before asking one to oversee your work. Where possible, connect with those on your short list to discuss your research goals and their availabilities for your desired study period.

2. APPLY FOR ADMISSION

Apply online at [uvic.ca/application](https://www.uvic.ca/application). You will be asked to pay your application fee by credit card.

3. APPLICATION STATUS

Shortly after you've applied, you'll receive your UVic student ID number by email. This will include instructions for checking your status online. You'll be contacted by email once an admission decision has been made, and you'll be notified if anything further is required. Make sure to add @uvic.ca to your safe-senders list.

4. ONCE YOU ARE ACCEPTED
