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## *John Michael Brownutt Graduate Scholarships*

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The John Michael Brownutt Graduate Scholarship is an award to recognize and support graduate Indigenous students with an outstanding GPA who have demonstrated community leadership.

- One (1) award of \$3,800 for a Master's level student
- One (1) award of \$3,800 for a Doctoral level student

### **Terms of Eligibility:**

*One or more scholarships are awarded to academically outstanding graduate Aboriginal (First Nation, Status, Non-Status, Inuit and Metis) students at the University of Victoria. Students must have demonstrated community involvement. Applications may be obtained from The Office of Indigenous Academic and Community Engagement (IACE) and must be submitted to that office. Approval of the recipients will be made by the Faculty of Graduate Studies Graduate Awards Committee, upon the recommendation of IACE.*

### **APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:**

- One (1) personal letter attesting to your involvement/leadership in Indigenous communities, organizations or committees (including on-campus organizations supporting the Indigenous community at UVic)
- Two (2) letters from Indigenous community leaders outlining the nature of your community involvement, either in a local Indigenous community or Indigenous organization
- One (1) academic reference preferably from your supervisor

\*Academically outstanding as noted in the terms above requires a GPA of 7.00/9.00 or higher (or equivalent) on the UVic grade scale in your most recently completed term of study in a degree program. For new students, GPA is based on the last 30 units of completed study. For current students, GPA is based on your cumulative GPA in your current graduate degree.
