Summary of duties and responsibilities

Under the supervision of the MEDS 433 course instructor, teaching assistant(s):

- will meet weekly with course instructor
- will attend virtual or in-person MEDS 433 scheduled classes as required to assist with attendance taking, set up of audio visual aids, teaching and learning tools and hosting guests;
- will find quotations, articles and websites;
- will assist with student projects;
- will mark assignments, midterm and final projects;
- may make short presentations in class;
- may assist with online learning systems;
- may liaise between students and class;
- may facilitate up to two (2) class sessions

The MEDS 433 course supervisor will complete the <u>Checklist of Assigned Duties and Approved Work Schedule</u> (Appendix 'E') with the incumbent by January 12, 2022.

Required qualifications and experience

- Applicants should possess an undergraduate degree in Biology, Biochemistry, Exercise Science,
 Physical and Health Education or acceptable equivalent.
- Prior experience as an instructor or teaching assistant would be an asset, but not a mandatory requirement.
- Willingness and ability to learn, on your own time, course content or other knowledge required to support the learning of the students.
