SUMMARY OF DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Responsibilities of the teaching assistant will include: moderating discussion boards and facilitating deep class discussions; timely and effective communication with students, the instructor, and other TA(s); creativity and a willingness to contribute substantially to developing excellent course content (including coordinating with guest lecturers); pre-testing quizzes and exams, and; grading written assignments and exams.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE:

Ideal candidates will hold a minimum master's degree. They will have excellent interpersonal, time management, and communication skills. Candidates will have a functional and pedagogical understanding of chronic disease among the elderly, and the influence of disease on health, functionality and quality of life of older people. They will have knowledge of the impact of high quality, safe, effective care and the design of systems encouraging and supporting quality care. A knowledge of chronic disease self-management and social support networks is useful.
