



COURSE PLANNING FOR BSW ADMITS

It is the responsibility of each student to plan their BSW Program to ensure that they will fulfill the University and the School degree completion requirements.

This form is intended as a guide for your course planning. For official documentation and degree planning please access your 'CAPP report/Degree Evaluation' via your [Uvic Online tools](#).

Requirements for completion of the BSW Degree include the following:

1. Social Work 200A & 200B or equivalents
2. UVic's [Academic Writing Requirement](#)
3. 60 units in total. If you enter the program with 30 units, you will require 2 general electives in order to obtain 60 units. The general electives may be any year-level.
4. 27 units must be 3rd and 4th year social work courses. 9 of these units are field education courses.

FREQUENTLY ASKED COURSE PLANNING QUESTIONS

How long do I have to complete the program?

We do not have a time limit for completion. Typically, students take 5-6 terms. However, you can take a shorter or longer time depending on how you want to program plan (part-time or full-time). See the School of Social Work policies on [maintaining your status as a BSW student](#).

How many courses should I take per term?

The level of engagement in the BSW program courses can be intense. We typically recommend taking a maximum of 4 courses per term. However, if you are a student who is accessing funding, please confirm directly with your funders how many courses they expect you to take per term.

How much time should I commit to each course per week?

In terms of course planning, expect to spend approximately 9 - 12 hours per week of study time per 1.5 units of coursework

How many courses should I take with my field education placement?

Usually, we recommend taking no additional courses or 1 course with your field education placement; however, we would not recommend any more than 2 courses. Do I have to take general electives?

If you enter the program with a previous degree (block credit) or 33 or more transfer units, you **do not** have to complete your general electives. However, if you enter with 30 transfer units, you will have to complete 2 general elective courses.
