## SESSIONAL INSTRUCTORS

Please note that each year we have more expressions of interest than we have teaching opportunities, and each year we have a different mix of variables that need to be taken into account. A number of changes are underway within our School; some of which may affect current teaching opportunities for sessional instructors. First, we have recently hired an Assistant Teaching Professor, Three Assistant Professors and an Associate Professor, and all tenured faculty members are expected to teach at least one course in our undergraduate program. Secondly, we have more PhD students teaching for us and doctoral students are given priority when assigning teaching.

*Qualifications*: Child and Youth Care practice experience and an MA in CYC or allied human services fields are essential to these positions. A PhD in CYC or allied human services fields is preferred. The salary range for 1.5 units of teaching is \$5,496 to \$6,680 (effective May 2018).
