- working collaboratively with other instructors
- As required, consultation with Faculty Course Leader or Director regarding the course structure and curriculum
- a working knowledge of instructional technology

Please indicate your preferences including the course(s) for which you would like to be considered, the semester(s) you are available to teach, and whether applying for online teaching only, oncampus only, or either/both.

Please note that each year we have more expressions of interest than we have teaching opportunities, and each year we have a different mix of variables that need to be taken into consideration. A number of changes are underway within our School, some of which may affect current teaching opportunities for sessional instructors. First, our graduate program is undergoing a renewal during the current academic year and so teaching assignments for tenured faculty members are only available from courses in the undergraduate program. Secondly, we have more PhD students teaching for us and doctoral students are given priority (after faculty members) when assigning teaching.

Qualifications: Child and Youth Care practice experience and an MA in CYC or allied human services fields are essential to these positions. A PhD in CYC or allied human services fields is preferred. The salary range for 1.5 units of teaching is \$5,936 to \$7,212 (effective May 2021).
