These are recommended UVic courses only, not required. Other UVic course combinations are also possible.

These types of courses are also typically offered at many institutions, and so similar courses may be transferable to UVic.

Please note you need the equivalent of 12 UVic units to access the BA program in year 2, and a minimum of 27 UVic units to enter year 3.

60 units are required to complete a UVic degree. Some applicants may need to top up required units depending upon admission credit.
