



## COURSE PLANNING FORMS FOR BSW STUDENTS

It is the responsibility of each student to plan their BSW Program to ensure that they will fulfill the University and The School of Social Work's degree completion requirements.

This form is intended as a guide for your course planning, for official documentation in respect to your degree planning please access your 'Degree Evaluation' tab at your UVic 'MyPage'. [www.uvic.ca/mypage](http://www.uvic.ca/mypage)

Requirements for completion of the BSW Degree include the following:

1. Social Work 200A & 200B or equivalents
2. UVic's Academic Writing Requirement: <https://www.uvic.ca/registrar/students/policies/awr/>
3. 60 units in total. If you enter the program with 30 units, you will require 2 general electives in order to obtain 60 units. The general electives may be any year level.
4. 27 units must be 3rd and 4th year social work courses (these can include HSD courses listed as Social Work electives). 9 of these units are field education courses.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED COURSE PLANNING QUESTIONS

### How many courses should I take per semester?

The level of engagement in the BSW program courses can be intensive. We typically recommend that 4 courses is the maximum amount of courses to take per semester.

### How many courses should I take with my field education placement?

Ideally, we would recommend taking 1 to no courses with your field education placement; however, we would not recommend any more than 2 courses with field education placement.

### How long do I have to complete the program?

We do not have a time limit for completion. Typically, students take 4-5 semesters. However, you can take a shorter or longer time depending on how you want to program plan.

### How many units is my course and/or field education?

Field education courses (304, 304A, 402, 404, and 404A) are 4.5 units each and courses are 1.5 units each

### How much time should I commit to each course per week?

In terms of course planning, expect to spend approximately 9-12 hours per week of study time per 1.5 units of coursework

### Do I have to take general electives?

If you enter the program with a previous degree (block credit) or 33 or more transfer units, you **do not** have to complete your general electives. However, if you enter with 30 transfer units, you will have to complete the 2 general electives courses.
