


DANICA MATTHEWS, SASKATOON, SK


MARK ADAM YIP, GALIANO ISLAND, BC


MISTELLE MONTAGUE, BRITISH COLUMBIA

I am thrilled to have completed my MSWI program and I am currently the new Circle Keeper for my organization.




KIANNA COOPER, VICTORIA, BC
