## Course Content.

A continuation of an introduction to language used by Deaf communities throughout North America. ASL 100A is required as prerequisite for this course or permission of the department. Emphasis on utilising on American Sign Language (ASL) vocabulary, and the means and tools in the application of appropriate linguistic structure such as facial grammar, non-manual signals (NMS) and expression and receptive skills. Additionally, the course will focus on clear, effective and appropriate production which is palm orientation, classifiers, movements and such. Placement whilst narrating in sign language will be practised in order to apply the fundamentals of the ASL structure. The utilisation, interaction, and promotion of cultural and linguistic behaviour throughout class time will be strongly encouraged in order to acquire the nuances of the language. Some insights of Deaf communities and culture in Canada will be offered.
