Course Content.

An immersive opportunity to increase comprehension of the language used by Deaf communities throughout North America. ASL 200A is required as prerequisite for this course or permission of the department. The emphasis of the course will be the essentials of fundamental structures for everyday interaction. It will encourage the development of appropriate grammatical features and facial grammar including non-manual signals. Students will also develop and practise receptive and expressive signing skills (production and execution). Some presentations will provide some insight into the Deaf community and Deaf Culture locally, nationally and internationally. The utilisation, interaction and promotion of cultural and linguistic behaviour throughout class time will be strongly encouraged in order to acquire the nuances of the language. It also enhances cultural sensitivity.
