Description

This 1.5-unit course does not have any prerequisites, i.e., no prior knowledge of linguistics is required. This Sign Language as Language course explores some common misconceptions about sign language that this course aims to dispel through a comparative overview of signed and spoken languages. The overview will include selected topics in the linguistic research of sign language and a selected topic(s) in Deaf culture and rights. (Note: This is not a course on learning how to sign.)
