Description

This 1.5-unit course does not have any prerequisites, i.e., no prior knowledge is required. How English Grammar Works describes the structure of English grammar, focusing on the forms and functions of the building blocks of the grammar, so you can learn the grammar but also learn about grammar. These building blocks comprise morphemes/words which combine into phrases, combining to create clauses and ultimately sentences, including variations of sentence patterns. These structures are not without purpose. Examples of how these structures can be used to meet the communicative objectives of the writer and a means to decode such objectives for the reader will be considered. The notion of language variety and standards will be briefly discussed.
