



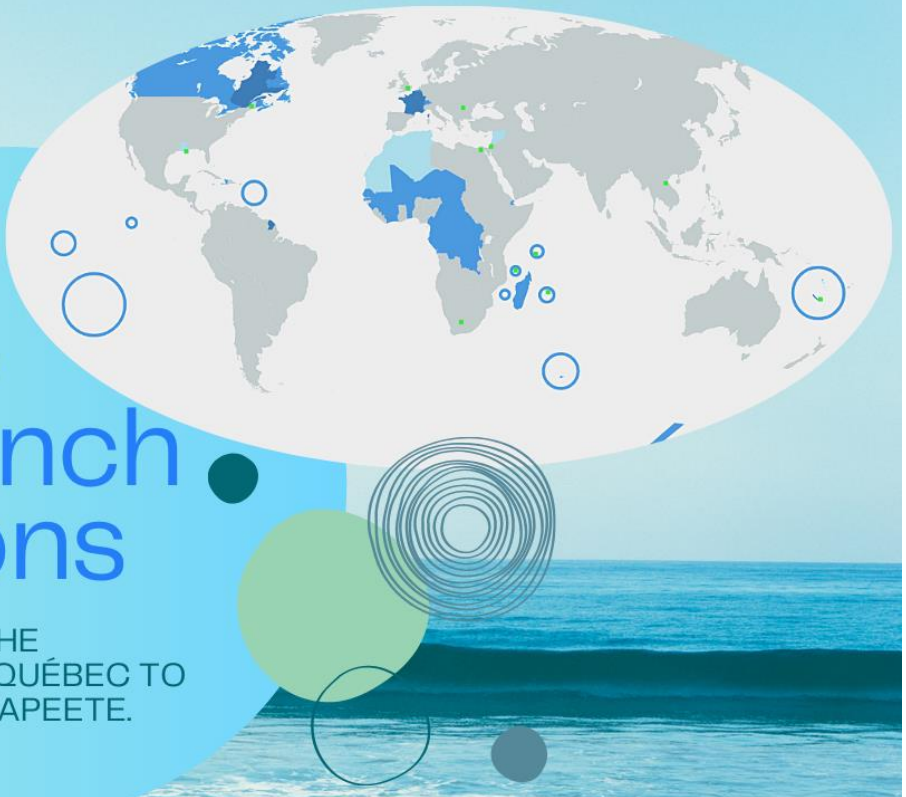

Description

Students will explore global French connections, their history and their contemporaneity. They will research and study the impacts of French and Belgian colonialism and the cultures and peoples it affected. A community-engaged component will connect students with the local Francophone community. Students will also complete experiential learning creative assignments to showcase the research conducted by Francophone faculty members, projects by artists or community organizations active outside of the university setting, and cultural, social and political issues across the Francophone world.

Prerequisite

Students are expected to have the ability to understand spoken and written French.
Class will be taught in French but assignments can be written in English.
