Professor Andrew Anderson specializes in later nineteenth-century and twentieth-century Peninsular literature. His research is principally concerned with Spanish poetry and theatre from the 1890s to 1930s. He has published ten books and critical editions of Spanish literature, over fifty articles, twenty-five bibliographies and thirty-five book reviews, and has lectured extensively in the US, Canada, England, Scotland, France, and Spain. He is associate editor of the *Boletín de la fundación Federico García Lorca* and a member of the editorial board of *Romance Quarterly*.
