He co-edited *The Atlantic in Global History*, authored *Puritan Conquistadors: Iberianizing the Atlantic, 1550–1700*, and *Nature, Empire, and Nation: Explorations of the History of Science in the Iberian World*, as well as *How to Write the History of the New World: Histories, Epistemologies, and Identities in the Eighteenth–Century Atlantic World*.
