


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## Lansdowne Lecture

Millicent (Penny) Marcus specializes in Italian culture from the interdisciplinary perspectives of literature, history, and film. She is the author of *An Allegory of Form: Literary Self–Consciousness in the Decameron*, and *Italian Film in the Light of Neorealism*, as well as *Filmmaking by the Book: Italian Cinema and Literary Adaptation*, and *After Fellini: National Cinema in the Postmodern Age*, and *Italian Film in the Shadow of Auschwitz*. She has also authored numerous journal articles on her fields of interest.

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
