### CHORALITY REVISITED: INDIGENOUS CHRONICLES IN MÉXICO AND PERÚ

Dr. José Antonio Mazzotti is the Gardner Cowles Associate Professor of Romance Languages and Literatures at Harvard University. His groundbreaking work on the mestizo humanist Inka Garcilaso de la Vega (1539-1616) has fundamentally reshaped our understanding of Peruvian colonial literature. In his conferences at the University of Victoria, Mazzotti will discuss how the prehispanic linguistic and cultural plurality of Perú and México was reflected in the writings of indigenous chroniclers and appropriated by Creole elites in the construction of a collective identity.
