

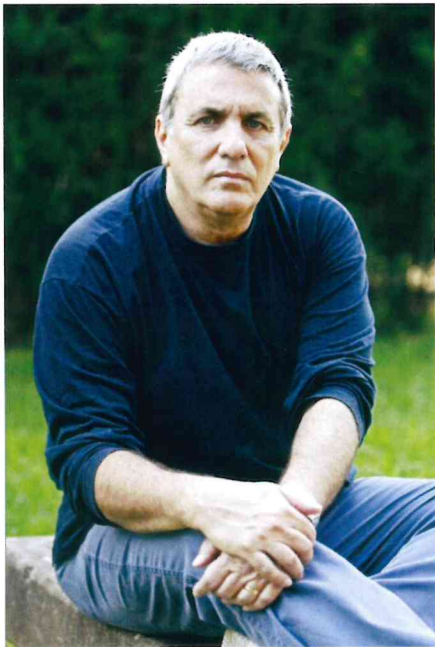

While in Cuba, he collaborated with some of the most prestigious literary Cuban journals, such as *El Caimán barbudo* and *La Gaceta de Cuba*. His work is highly respected in the field of contemporary Cuban literature.
