Barbara Zecchi is an internationally renowned Hispanist, whose research focuses on Gender Studies, Cinema, and Digital Humanities. She has authored two monographs, *La pantalla sexuada* (Cátedra 2014) and *Desenfocadas* (Icaria, 2014); and co-edited four volumes: *Gynocine; Teoría y práctica de la adaptación cinematográfica; La mujer en la España actual; and Sexualidad y escritura*. She has also published over thirty peer-reviewed journal articles. At the University of Massachusetts-Amherst, she is the director of the Spanish and Portuguese unit and coordinates the Digital Humanities Project "Gynocine: A History of Women's Cinema".
