
Lecture Series

Mareike Kleine illustrates informal norms and tests how they work, to provide the first systematic analysis, based on new material from national and European archives and other primary data, of the parallel development of the formal rules and informal norms that have governed the EU from the 1958 Treaty of Rome until today.

Dr. Kleine joined the European Institute in September 2009 as a Lecturer in EU and International Politics. Her research interests include-theories of international organisation and International Political Economy, informal and formal governance, the interplay of domestic politics and international institutions, negotiation theories and normative questions of global governance.
