Course Content.

Focuses on building ASL vocabulary and applying core linguistic structures, including facial grammar, non-manual signals (NMS), and expressive and receptive skills. Additionally, the course will focus on clear, effective and appropriate production which is palm orientation, classifiers, movements and such. Placement while narrating in sign language will be practised in order to apply the fundamentals of the ASL structure. The utilisation, interaction, and promotion of cultural and linguistic behaviour throughout class time will be strongly encouraged in order to acquire the nuances of the language.
