This course focuses on works written in French or translated into French from an Indigenous language by First Nations, Métis and Inuit artists. Students will explore Indigenous literatures from the territory colonially known as Canada in their historical, political, sociological and cultural contexts. Students will also learn about Indigenous literatures from other geographical areas of the global Francophonie, connecting them with issues of resistance and resurgence as they appear in Canada.
