- Hold regular office hours for students
- Undertake the grading of assessments according to UVic's grading policies and practices
- Compile course grades and submit final grades
- Manage grade appeals and deferral requests in a timely manner
- If the course has one or more TAs (dependent on enrollments):
 - o Work with TAs in accordance with UVic's [LTSI guidelines](#)
 - o Hold regular meetings with TAs to ensure course continuity and cohesiveness
 - o Oversee the work of TAs to ensure that grading standards are maintained and that marks are appropriate and uniformly applied
