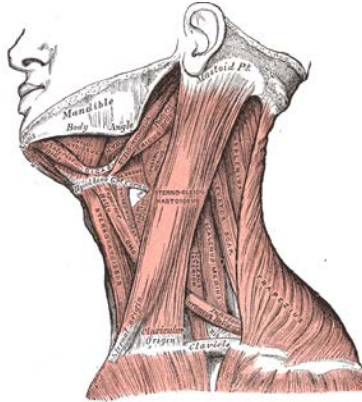

Course Content.

This 1.5-unit course has LING 200 – Introduction to Phonetics and Phonology as a prerequisite. This ensures a solid foundation of knowledge and skills to build upon in LING 381. This course explores the physiology of the human speech production including aspects of the respiratory, laryngeal, pharyngeal, and supralaryngeal articulatory systems, and neurological control systems. We will work towards remembering, understanding, applying, analyzing, evaluating, and/or creating factual, conceptual, procedural, and/or metacognitive knowledge in the area of articulatory phonetics.
