Required qualifications and experience

Appointment procedures are based on the guidelines of the CUPE 4163 Agreement, TA Appendix Article 13.02. Selection criteria for all positions will include the qualifications and ability of the candidate(s) based on academic merit and related experience, the career and/or pedagogical value that the experience in a particular position will provide the student, the student's preferences, and other sources of graduate student financial support being received. All applications will be considered; however, priority will first be given to graduate students registered in the Department of French and Francophone Studies, in accordance with the Department's Appointment Priority Policy, including any graduate students with conditional offers of employment included in an offer of admission. All TAs must have excellent oral and written skills in French and excellent experience in learning technology.
