

DEFINITIONS -- STUDENTS

Undergraduate Students

Undergraduates are those admitted to undergraduate credit programs. Full-time undergraduate students are enrolled for at least 12 units of credit in the winter session (September to April); those with less than 12 units are part-time. A full-time equivalent (FTE) value for each student is ordinarily calculated by dividing individual credit units by 15 or by the normal annual load.

The measure, **Degree FTE students**, for a particular faculty is the sum of FTE values of all those declaring a degree in that faculty. For example, a student taking an education course, who has declared a degree in Arts and Science, contributes the FTE values of that course to Arts and Science.

Graduate Students

Graduate students are those admitted to credit programs in the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

Degree FTE students means the sum of full-time and one-third of part-time.
