# **Study Permit Conditions**

#### As a study permit holder, you must:

- Be enrolled at a <u>designated learning institution (DLI)</u>, unless you're exempt
- Show you're actively pursuing your studies, unless you're exempt, by
  - Being enrolled full-time or part-time during each academic semester (excluding regularly scheduled breaks)
  - Making progress towards completing your program's courses **and**
  - Not taking <u>authorized leaves longer than 150 days</u> from your study program

**Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC)** – <u>Study Permit</u> <u>Conditions</u>



# **Enrolment Requirement**

#### Study permit conditions:

• Full-time or part-time enrolment during regular academic sessions

#### Full-time enrolment **is required** for:

- <u>Working with a study permit</u>
- <u>Post-Graduation Work Permit</u>
- <u>Spousal Open Work permit</u>



## UVic Academic Year

#### • Winter session (September - April)

- Further divided into fall term and spring term
- Regular sessions for all degree programs students


#### Summer session (May - August)

- Further divided into several terms of varying length
- Regular sessions for Grad and some UG degree programs (e.g., Business and Engineering program students)



# Full-time Definition for Undergrad

- Minimum 6 units in a single term or summer session
- Minimum 12 units in fall term and spring term combined (Winter session)
- A co-op term enrolment in a 4month term
- <u>Undergraduate</u> <u>Calendar</u>




Summer sessions are considered scheduled breaks for many UG programs.

# Full-time Definition for **GRAD**

- Continuous enrolment required
- Minimum 3 units in a single term
- Enrolled in:
  - Candidacy Exam (693)
  - Dissertation (699)
  - Thesis (599)
  - Project (598 and some 596) or (<u>GS 502</u>), (<u>GS 601</u>)
- Enrolment in a Co-op term
- Graduate Calendar



Summer sessions (May to August) are regular academic terms!
