### What is work?

#### **Volunteer vs paid work**

"Work" is defined in the Regulations as an activity for which wages are paid or commission is earned, or that competes with activities of Canadian citizens or permanent residents in the Canadian labour market. (IRCC)



## Study permit work authorization

To work **on campus** without a work permit, you must:

- have started your studies and
- have a valid study permit with on-campus employment remarks and
- be registered in a full-time courseload at UVic during regular academic sessions and
- have a social insurance number (SIN)

On campus = All the buildings on the UVic campus



## Study permit work authorization

To work **off campus**, you must:

- have started your studies and
- have a valid study permit with off-campus employment remarks and
- be in a degree, diploma or certificate program of at least six months in duration and
- be registered in a full-time course load at UVic during regular academic sessions and
- have a social insurance number (SIN)

## How many hours can you work off campus?

### **During regular academic sessions**

24 hours per week during regular academic sessions

#### **During your scheduled breaks**

 Full-time during scheduled breaks if you maintain full-time status before and after the break

# Co-op and experiential learning

- If your program at UVic includes a work component such as co-op, internship, or practicum, even if it is unpaid, you will need a co-op work permit.
- The co-op work permit can only be used for work that is an integral component of your program of study at UVic.
- To apply for a co-op work permit, you will need a letter from your UVic Co-op, internship, or practicum program confirming work is required for your program or course.

## Post-graduation work permit (PGWP)

#### According to current Canadian immigration policy, you must:

- Complete an eligible program in Canada that's at least 8 months in length
- Maintain full-time enrolment in all regular academic sessions except for an <u>authorized leave</u> of <u>absence</u> or final term
- You must complete at least 50% of your program in-class inside Canada
- You must provide proof of language ability to meet the language requirements for the PGWP when you submit your application
- There are no field of study requirements for university graduates with a bachelor's degree, master's degree or doctoral degree
- Field of study requirements apply to graduates of certificate and diploma programs contact us for support



### Social insurance number

- Required to receive payment for work
- You can apply online, by mail or in person to Service Canada
- Required documents:
  - Valid study permit with employment remarks or a work permit
  - Primary identification (ID)
  - Secondary piece of ID to prove your identity
  - Acceptable proof of address (for some applications)
