### **WHAT IS PGWP?**

#### A PGWP Is.....

- An open work permit
- Allows you to gain Canadian work experience after graduation (e.g., full-time, part-time, self-employment)
- Possible occupational restrictions (e.g. healthcare, primary/secondary school, childcare)
- Can only be issued once per lifetime



# UVIC DEFINITIONS & PGWP ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

### **General PGWP Eligibility**

- Complete an eligible program in Canada that's at least 8 months in length
- ➤ Continuous full-time enrolment in all regular academic sessions except for authorized leave of absence or final term
- ➤ As of September 1, 2024, you must complete at least 50% of your program in class inside Canada
- ➤ As of November 1, 2024, you must provide <u>proof of language ability</u> to meet the language requirements for PGWP when you submit your application
- There are no field of study requirements for university graduates with a bachelor's degree, master's degree or doctoral degree


#### **Regular Academic Sessions**

- Winter session (Sept-April)
   Fall term (Sept-Dec)
   Spring term (Jan to April)
- Summer session (May to Aug)



Full-time Definition For Undergrad

- Minimum 6 units in a 4month term
- Minimum 12 units in fall term and spring term combined (Winter session)
- A co-op term enrolment in a 4-month term




Summer sessions are considered scheduled breaks for many UG programs.

**Full-time Definition For Grad** 

Continuous enrolment required

- Minimum 3 units in single term
- Enrolment in a Co-op term

### **PGWP Validity**

A PGWP can be granted for a minimum of 8 months to a maximum of 3 years.

- 8 months to < 2 years = the length of the program completed</li>
- 2 years or longer = 3 years
- As of February 15, 2024, students who graduate from master's degree programs or less than 2 years and more than 8 months may be eligible for a 3-year PGWP

# **COVID-19 SPECIAL MEASURES**

### **Temporary Policy: Distance Learning**

- Distance Learning from outside Canada
  - You can complete up to 100% of your studies online from outside Canada between March 2020 and August 31, 2022, because of a temporary COVID-19 policy.
- Distance Learning from inside Canada
  - If your courses were moved online due to the pandemic, the time you spend studying online from within Canada until **August 31, 2024,** still counts toward the length of your PGWP.

### **Temporary Policy: Distance Learning**

• All students who started a program of study between September 1, 2022, and August 31, 2024, are required to complete at least 50% of their program of study in Canada (online or in class).

 For the above group of students, up until August 31, 2024, time spent studying outside of Canada can be counted toward the overall length of the PGWP only if it constitutes less than 50% of the program.

\*Any time a student spend studying outside of Canada **after** August 31, 2024, and any time spent studying outside Canada before applying for a study permit, will be deducted from the length of the PGWP, regardless of when the student started or will start their program of study.\*

### **PGWP Eligibility - Exception**

- If you had to stop studying or changed your status to part-time between spring and summer 2020 for reasons related to COVID-19, you are still eligible for a PGWP.
  - Official UVic letter regarding COVID-19
  - Personal letter of explanation and relevant supporting documents

### **APPLYING FOR PGWP**

### **How To Apply For A PGWP**

- Apply online
  - As of June 21, 2024, you can no longer apply for a PGWP at a port of entry (POE).
- You must apply within 180 days after you receive your final grade
- In Canada: Apply within 90
  days after you receive your final
  grade AND while your study is valid

### **Documentation Requirements**

- Application form <u>IMM5710</u> (inside Canada) or <u>IMM 1295</u> (outside Canada)
- Degree completion letter
- Official transcript or administrative transcript from UVic Online tools with final grades
- Valid passport
- Digital photo

- Credit or debit card to pay your fees online
- Proof of meeting minimum levels of language ability (CLB 7)
- Medical exam (if applicable)

■ Biometrics (if applicable)

### **PGWP Application Tips**

- Apply for graduation in your final term.
- Your degree completion letter will be issued when your final grades are available in your <u>UVic Online tools</u>.
- Only submit your PGWP application when you receive UVic documents (a degree completion letter AND final transcript) and other required documents.
- Make sure you book an <u>approved language test</u> (IELTS general) well in advance
- Online applications are saved in your IRCC secure account for up to 60 days only.

### **PGWP Application Tips**

- Keep paper or electronic copies of your application form and supporting documents.
- Take screenshots at different stages and monitor your application status online.
- Apply as soon as you collect all the required documents.
- Use the <u>IRCC Web Form</u> to update IRCC or follow up on application status.
- Consult us before you submit the application if you have questions.

### **After You Apply**

- Current processing time
- Working while your PGWP application is under process
   You can work full time after you submit your application and until a decision is made if you
  - ☐ had a <u>valid study permit</u> at the time **you submitted your application**
  - completed your study program
  - were eligible to work off campus without a work permit while studying and you didn't work more hours than you were allowed to

\*If you don't meet all the conditions above to work, you must stop working after you receive your final mark and wait until you receive your PGWP to start working.

Maryam completed her final co-op term on August 19, 2024. She received her co-op completion mark on August 30, 2024, and her degree completion letter was issued to her on September 6, 2024. This is the last requirement for her to meet her degree graduation requirements. Her study permit has the expiry date of December 31, 2024.

### When does Maryam's study permit expire?

- a) September 6, 2024
- b) November 28, 2024
- c) December 31, 2024

Maryam completed her final co-op term on August 19, 2024. She received her co-op completion mark on August 30, 2024, and her degree completion letter was issued to her on September 6, 2024. This is the last requirement for her to meet her degree graduation requirements. Her study permit has the expiry date of December 31, 2024.

When should Maryam apply for her PGWP in Canada if she wants to start working as soon as possible?
